# New crew named Expedition 64 is going to the International Space Station

In the latest news in Space, NASA is sending a crew of astronauts to the International Space Station (ISS) called Expedition 64. This crew comprises seven members on board of the ISS. Their names are Kathleen Rubin (Expedition 48, 49, and 63), Sergey Ryzhikov (Expedition 63, 50, and 49), Sergey Kud-Sverchkov (Expedition 63). Michael S. Hopkins, Victor J. Glover, Soichi Noguchi, and Shannon Walker.

They launched the members into space on Wednesday, October 14th, and will end their mission on April 18, 2021. There will be two space ships arriving to the ISS. Soyuz MS-17 was the first one and arrived safely at the ISS on October 14th, carrying 3 members. The remaining crew members will go on another spacecraft called SpaceX Crew-1. It was expected to launch on October 31st, but will be delayed until early to-mid November because of some technical difficulties that theSpaceX rockets had in previous launches.

### The Response to School Bullying



Bullying can be a problem in schools, and many students have experienced some form of bullying. There are many ways someone can be bullied. However, due to coronavirus concerns and with the rise of remote learning, cyberbullying this year will be more prevalent. I asked the principal, Mr. Bargna, what the school will do this year if there was such a problem. He responded: "We do not tolerate bullying. If there is an accusation of bullying, the anti-bullying team will conduct a thorough investigation, where parents are notified, and bullying paperwork would be completed. The anti-bullying specialists would then interview both parties and any witnesses. The interviews would be analyzed by the anti-bullying committee and they would determine if bullying occurred. Consequences will then be determined, and after the investigation is completed, a copy of the findings are sent to the superintendent, and parents are notified of the decision. If any student is being bullied they need to make their teacher, guidance counselor or administrators know, so it does not continue." So if you or someone you know is being bullied, please inform an adult, and seek help.
